COMMITTEE ACTION

June 26, 2025

The Committee on Homeland Security met, pursuant to notice, in open markup session, a quorum being present, on Wednesday, June 25, 2025, at 10:00 a.m. EDT in 310 Cannon to consider the following measures:

H.R. 3965, (Mr. Tony Gonzales of Texas), To establish in U.S. Customs and Border Protection a pilot program to adopt dogs from local animal shelters to be trained as support dogs, and for other purposes; the “Providing Emotional Assistance with Relief and Love Act” or “PEARL Act”.

H.R. 4070, (Mr. Knott), To require a homeland security border threat assessment on Tren de Aragua and associated strategic plan, and for other purposes.; the “Tren de Aragua Border Security Threat Assessment Act”,

H.R. 4071, (Mr. Guest), To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to enhance the operations of U.S. Customs and Border Protection in foreign countries, and for other purposes; the “Combatting International Drug Trafficking and Human Smuggling Partnership Act of 2025”.

H.R. 4057, (Mr. Correa), To establish a pilot program on home kenneling of canines for U.S. Customs and Border Protections Office of Field Operations, and for other purposes; the “CBP Canine Home Kenneling Pilot Act”.

H.R. 4058, (Mr. Goldman of New York), To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to enhance outreach for the Urban Area Security Initiative and the State Homeland Security Grant Program of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes; the “Enhancing Stakeholder Support and Outreach for Preparedness Grants Act”.

The Committee took the following actions:
