14           national multi-factor authentication campaign;

15           (3) \$400,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency for the implementation  
16           of Executive Order 14028 (86 Fed. Reg. 26633; re-

1       lating to improving the cybersecurity of the United  
2       States), including the implementation of multi-factor  
3       authentication, endpoint detection and response, im-  
4       proved logging, and securing cloud systems;

5           (4) \$50,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
6       frastructure Security Agency for expansion and op-  
7       eration of the Crossfeed program;

8           (5) \$10,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
9       frastructure Security Agency for performing activi-  
10      ties in support of the development of the continuity  
11      of the economy plan required under section 9603(a)  
12      of title XCVI of the William M. (Mac) Thornberry  
13      National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year  
14      2021 (Public Law 116–283; 6 U.S.C. 322);

15          (6) \$20,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
16      frastructure Security Agency for expanding pro-  
17      grams working with international partners on the  
18      protection of critical infrastructure;

19          (7) \$100,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
20      frastructure Security Agency for cybersecurity work-  
21      force development and education, including providing  
22      education, training, and capacity development and to  
23      the Cybersecurity Education and Training Program,  
24      to be used for purposes that include—

1 (A) cybersecurity training and upskilling  
2 veterans;

3 (B) implementing cybersecurity apprentice-  
4 ships at the Agency; and

5 (C) cybersecurity programs for under-  
6 served communities, as a focus for activities au-  
7 thorized under section 2217 of the Homeland  
8 Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 665f); and

9 (8) \$210,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and In-  
10 frastructure Security Agency for general operations  
11 and support.
