Page 3, after line 11, insert the following:

1 SEC. 50002. NATIONAL TARGETING CENTER.

2 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
3 appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the
4 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$60,000,000 to
5 remain available until September 30, 2031, to Customs
6 and Border Protection to increase the screening and
7 vetting capabilities of the National Targeting Center to
8 address the increased terrorist threat to the homeland as a
9 result of the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan.

Page 3, after line 11, insert the following:

4 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
5 appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the
6 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$10,000,000 to
7 remain available until September 30, 2031, to Immigration
8 and Customs Enforcement, for Biometric Identification
9 Transnational Migration Alert Program (BITMAP)
10 operations, including to—

11 (1) coordinate and facilitate the voluntary
12 sharing of biometric and biographic information
13 collected from foreign nationals for the purpose of
14 identifying and screening such nationals to identify
15 those nationals who may pose a terrorist threat or a
16 threat to national security or border security;

1 (2) provide capabilities, including training
2 and equipment, to partner countries to voluntarily
3 collect biometric and biographic identification data
4 from individuals to identify, prevent, detect, and
5 interdict high risk individuals identified as national
6 security, border security, or terrorist threats who
7 may attempt to enter the United States utilizing
8 illicit pathways; and

9 (3) provide capabilities, including training
10 and equipment, to partner countries to compare
11 foreign data against appropriate United States
12 national security, border security, terrorist,
13 immigration, and counter-terrorism data.

4 appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the
5 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$865,000,000 to
6 remain available until September 30, 2031, to the
7 Department of Homeland Security for the design, testing,
8 construction, installation, deployment, integration, and
9 operation of physical barriers, tactical infrastructure,
10 technology, and other border security infrastructure along
11 the international border between the United States and
12 Mexico.

2 **TASK FORCE.**

3 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
4 appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the
5 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$25,000,000 to
6 remain available until September 30, 2031, to Immigration
7 and Customs Enforcement for Border Enforcement
8 Security Task Force operations, including—

9 (1) to support collaboration among Federal,
10 State, local, tribal, and foreign law enforcement
11 agencies to execute coordinated activities in
12 furtherance of border security and homeland
13 security;

1 (2) to enhance information-sharing, including
2 the dissemination of homeland security information
3 among such agencies; and
4 (3) for the direct hiring of 1811 series
5 criminal investigators.

1 **SEC. 50002. FUNDING LIMITATION ON**

4 None of the funds made available by this title may
5 be used by the Department of Homeland Security to enter
6 into or renew a contract for the procurement of—

7 (1) an unmanned aircraft system (UAS)
8 that—

9 (A) is manufactured in the People’s
10 Republic of China or by a corporation
11 domiciled in the People’s Republic of China;

12 (B) uses flight controllers, radios, data
13 transmission devices, cameras, or gimbals
14 manufactured in the People’s Republic of
15 China or by a corporation domiciled in the
16 People’s Republic of China;

1 (C) uses a ground control system or
2 operating software developed in the People's
3 Republic of China or by a corporation
4 domiciled in the People's Republic of China;
5 or

6 (D) uses network connectivity or data
7 storage located in the People's Republic of
8 China or administered by a corporation
9 domiciled in the People's Republic of China;

10 (2) a software operating system associated
11 with a UAS that uses network connectivity or data
12 storage located in the People's Republic of China or
13 administered by a corporation domiciled in the
14 People's Republic of China; or

15 (3) a system for the detection or identification
16 of a UAS, which system is manufactured in the
17 People's Republic of China or by a corporation
18 domiciled in the People's Republic of China.

5 remain available until September 30, 2031, to the
6 Transportation Security Administration for salary
7 increases, bonuses, and COVID-19 Exposure Pay for the
8 following frontline employees—

9 (1) TSA security screeners;

10 (2) Federal Air Marshals; and

11 (3) Other frontline employees determined by the
12 Administrator of the Transportation Security
13 Administration to provide direct security to the
14 traveling public.

1 **SEC. 50002. TSA SECURITY TECHNOLOGY.**

2 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
3 appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the
4 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$1,800,000,000 to
5 remain available until September 30, 2031, to the
6 Transportation Security Administration, for—

7 (1) the procurement and deployment of
8 computed tomography screening equipment to
9 enhance detection capabilities for carry-on
10 baggage;

11 (2) the procurement and deployment of
12 credential authentication technology to improve the
13 verification and validation of passenger
14 identification documentation and confirm Secure
15 Flight risk status for passenger screening; and

1 (3) research and development activities to
2 incorporate biometric, digital identity, and mobile
3 drivers license verification capabilities at the
4 checkpoint.

5 remain available until September 30, 2031, to Customs
6 and Border Protection for the hiring, training, and
7 equipping of 2,000 Border Patrol Agents.

After page 3, line 11, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 50002. AFGHANISTAN WITHDRAWAL**
2 **THREAT ASSESSMENT.**

3 (a) THREAT ASSESSMENT.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of
5 Homeland Security, in coordination with the
6 Secretary of Defense and the Director of National
7 Intelligence, shall conduct a threat assessment of
8 terrorist threats to the United States posed by the
9 prisoners released by the Taliban from the Pul-e-
10 Charkhi Prison and Parwan Detention Facility in
11 Afghanistan.

12 (2) ELEMENTS.—The assessment required
13 under paragraph (1) shall include the following:

14 (A) With respect to the prisoners
15 released by the Taliban from the Pul-e-
16 Charkhi Prison and Parwan Detention

1 Facility in Afghanistan, information relating

2 to—

3 (i) the number of such prisoners

4 who were released;

5 (ii) the country of origin for each

6 such prisoner; and

7 (iii) any affiliation with a

8 foreign terrorist organization for each

9 such prisoner.

10 (B) The capability of the Department

11 of Homeland Security, the Department of

12 Defense, and the Intelligence Community to

13 identify, track, and monitor such prisoners

14 and any associated challenges with such

15 capability.

16 (C) Any action of the Department of

17 Homeland Security, the Department of

18 Defense, or the Intelligence Community with

19 respect to—

1 (i) mitigating the terrorist
2 threats to the United States posed by
3 such prisoners; and

4 (ii) preventing such prisoners
5 from entering the United States.

6 (b) CONGRESSIONAL NOTIFICATION.—Not
7 later than 60 days after the date of the enactment of this
8 Act, the Secretary shall—

9 (1) submit to the appropriate congressional
10 committees the threat assessment required under
11 subsection (a); and

12 (2) provide a briefing to the appropriate
13 congressional committees on such assessment.

14 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:

15 (1) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL
16 COMMITTEES.—The term “appropriate
17 congressional committees” means—

18 (A) the Committee on Homeland
19 Security of the House of Representatives;

1 (B) the Committee on Armed Services
2 of the House of Representatives;

3 (C) the Permanent Select Committee
4 on Intelligence of the House of
5 Representatives;

6 (D) the Committee on Homeland
7 Security and Governmental Affairs of the
8 Senate;

9 (E) the Committee on Armed Services
10 of the Senate; and

11 (F) the Select Committee on
12 Intelligence of the Senate.

13 (2) FOREIGN TERRORIST
14 ORGANIZATION.—The term “foreign terrorist
15 organization” means an organization designated as
16 a foreign terrorist organization under section 219 of
17 the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
18 1189).

19 (3) INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY.—The
20 term “intelligence community” has the meaning

1 given the term in section 3(4) of the National
2 Security Act of 1947 (50 U.S.C. 3003(4)).

5 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$25,000,000 to
6 remain available until September 30, 2031, to Immigration
7 and Customs Enforcement for Transnational Criminal
8 Investigative Units (TCIUs) to—

9 (1) enhance cooperation between Homeland
10 Security Investigations and trusted and vetted
11 foreign law enforcement partners to identify
12 targets, collect evidence, share information, and
13 facilitate the prosecution of transnational criminal
14 organizations; and

15 (2) provide stipends for vetted unit officers.

1 **SEC. 50002. OPERATION STONEGARDEN.**

2 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
3 appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the
4 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$40,000,000 to
5 remain available until September 30, 2031, to the Federal
6 Emergency Management Agency for the Operation
7 Stonegarden grant program to enhance border security by
8 providing grants to law enforcement agencies that are
9 involved in Customs and Border Protection operations, for
10 eligible costs, including—

11 (1) equipment, including maintenance and
12 sustainment costs;

13 (2) personnel, including overtime and
14 backfill, in support of enhanced border law
15 enforcement activities;

1 (3) any activity permitted for Operation
2 Stonegarden under the Department of Homeland
3 Security's most recent Homeland Security Grant
4 Program Notice of Funding Opportunity; and

5 (4) any other appropriate activity, as
6 determined by the Administrator of the Federal
7 Emergency Management Agency, in consultation
8 with the Commissioner of Customs and Border
9 Protection.

1 **SEC. 50002. CISA RANSOMWARE MITIGATION.**

2 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is
3 appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the
4 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$210,000,000 to
5 remain available until expended, to the Cybersecurity and
6 Infrastructure Security Agency to address cybersecurity
7 threats, including ransomware, by enhancing the capacity
8 of regional cybersecurity advisors to provide education,
9 support, and protection to state, local, tribal, and territorial
10 governments, including—

11 (1) \$4,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and
12 Infrastructure Security Agency to provide advice
13 and support to preparedness grant programs of the
14 Federal Emergency Management Agency that
15 prioritize cybersecurity; and

1 (2) \$20,000,000 to the Cybersecurity and
2 Infrastructure Security Agency to provide advice
3 and support to state, local, tribal, and territorial
4 governments, including the hiring of additional
5 regional cybersecurity advisors.

6 countermeasure development, and incident
7 response services across all domains; and

8 (B) \$10,000,000 for exercises and activities
9 of the Joint Cyber Planning Office, including
10 cybersecurity exercises, cyber operations, and
11 operational planning.

4 be used for the acquisition of software that is not in
5 compliance with Section 4 of the Executive Order on
6 Improving the Nation's Cybersecurity.

Page 3, after line 11, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 50002. GAO AUDIT ON USE OF FUNDS.**

2 Not later than one year after the date of enactment
3 of this title, and every two years thereafter until 2031, the
4 Comptroller General shall—

5 (1) audit the use of funds appropriated
6 pursuant to this title; and

7 (2) submit a report to the Committee on
8 Homeland Security of the House and the Committee
9 on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of
10 the Senate, a report on the use of funds appropriated
11 pursuant to this title, including any instances of
12 waste, fraud, or abuse identified by the Comptroller
13 General.

Page 3, after line 11, insert the following:

1 **SEC. 50002. PROHIBITION ON THE**
2 **CONDITIONING OF CISA SERVICES.**

3 No funds appropriated by this title may be used to
4 condition the services of the Cybersecurity and
5 Infrastructure Security Agency on compliance with
6 federal regulations or orders relating to COVID-19
7 vaccines.
