Title V- Homeland Security

Build Back Better Act (H.R. 5376)

Title V of the Build Back Better Act appropriates **\$1.5 billion** to the Department of Homeland Security to address three pressing national security challenges as follows:

- \$500 million to improve our national cybersecurity posture by funding the following activities:
 - <u>Federal Cyber Capacity Building</u>: CISA's cybersecurity risk mitigation efforts (\$100 million) cyber workforce development (\$100 million), and securing cloud architecture (\$50 million);
 - <u>State and Local Cybersecurity</u>: Cybersecurity recruitment and training at State level (\$80 million), support for MS-ISAC to monitor threats to State IT systems (\$35 million), migration to the .gov internet domain (\$20 million), and Cybersecurity Education and Training Assistance Program to train teachers on cyber and enhance cyber capacity (\$15 million);
 - <u>Critical Infrastructure Cybersecurity</u>: CyberSentry program (\$50 million) and research and development to better secure operational technology and industrial control systems (\$50 million).
- \$100 million to help to secure places of worship against domestic terrorist and other threats, with funding equally divided between non-profits in UASI jurisdictions and not in UASI jurisdictions; and
- \$900 million to intensify DHS' efforts to reduce its carbon footprint through sustainability and environmental programs.
