COMMITTEE ACTION

The Committee on Homeland Security met, pursuant to notice, in open markup session, a quorum being present, on Wednesday, February 12, 2020, in 310 of the Cannon House Office Building and considered the following measures:

H.R. 5736, (Mr. Rose) The “Transnational White Supremacist Extremism Review Act”;

H.R. 5780, (Ms. Underwood) The “Safe Communities Act of 2020”;

H.R. 5802, (Mr. Correa) The “TSA Child Care Availability and Resources for Employees Act” or “TSA Child CARE Act”;

H.R. 5804, (Mr. Crenshaw) The “DHS Blue Campaign Enhancement Act”;

H.R. 5811, (Mr. Katko) The “TSA Personnel Workplace Improvement Act of 2020”;

H.R. 5822, (Ms. Titus) The “Homeland Security Acquisition Professional Career Program Act”;

H.R. 5823, (Mr. Richmond) The “State and Local Cybersecurity Improvement Act”;

H.R. 5824, (Ms. Torres Small) The “Federal Law Enforcement Training Research and Reporting Act of 2020”;

H.R. 5828, (Mrs. Lesko) The “DHS Illicit Cross-Border Tunnel Defense Act”;

S. 2035, (Ms. Duckworth) The “TSA Credential and Endorsement Harmonization Act of 2019”.

The Committee took the following actions:

A unanimous consent request by the Chairman that H.R. 5736; H.R. 5780; H.R. 5804; H.R. 5811; H.R. 5822 H.R. 5823 and H.R. 5828 be considered, the amendments prefiled and listed on the roster be adopted; the measures as amended be agreed to; the measures as so amended be ordered to be reported to the House with a favorable recommendation; was not objected to.

Page 4, line 15, strike “and other entities, as appropriate,” and insert “and, as appropriate, other entities, including non-profit organizations,”.

Page 5, beginning line 15, insert the following: (10) A description of how to prioritize engagement with critical infrastructure sectors based on threat information and the capacity of such sectors to mitigate such threats.

The Committee adopted H.R. 5804, as amended, by unanimous consent.

Page 2, line 4, strike “is amended by adding” and insert the following: “is amended—”

(1) in subsection (e)(6), by striking “utilizing resources,” and inserting “developing and utilizing, in consultation with the Advisory Board established pursuant to subsection (g), resources”; and (2) by adding

Page 2, line 14, strike “Detention and” and insert “Non-Federal”.

Page 3, beginning line 9, strike “Trends and patterns in human trafficking” and insert “Recruitment tactics used by human traffickers”.

Page 3, line 13, strike “campaigns for” and insert “tools for distribution to”.

Page 3, line 18, strike “provide assistance in”.

(d) NOTIFICATION.—The Administrator of the Transportation Security Administration shall inform Administration personnel about the availability under subsection (a) of facilities designed for use by nursing mothers in the workplace.

The following amendment was offered and agreed to by unanimous consent:

Page 4, line 18, insert “post-program graduation” before “retention”.

Page 4, line 21, strike “Information on the” and insert “The”.

Page 4, line 24, strike “improve the efficacy of the program and”.

The Committee adopted H.R. 5823, as amended, by unanimous consent.

Page 21, after line 4, insert the following:

**“SEC. 2216. CYBERSECURITY RESOURCE GUIDE
DEVELOPMENT FOR STATE, LOCAL, TRIBAL, AND TERRITORIAL
GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS.**

“The Secretary, acting through the Director, shall develop a resource guide for use by State, local, Tribal, and territorial government officials, including law enforcement officers, to help such officials identify, prepare for, detect, protect

against, respond to, and recover from cybersecurity risks, cybersecurity threats, and incidents (as such term is defined in section 2209).”.

Page 21, beginning line 5, strike subsection (b) and insert the following:

(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 is amended by inserting after the item relating to section 2214 the following new items:

“Sec. 2215. State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program.

“Sec. 2216. Cybersecurity resource guide development for State, local, Tribal, and territorial government officials.”.

An amendment offered by Mr. Langevin.

Page 4, beginning line 11, insert the following:

“(iv) promote the delivery of safe, recognizable, and trustworthy online services by State, local, Tribal, and territorial governments, including through the use of the .gov internet domain;”.

Page 20, beginning line 17, insert the following:

“(9) ONLINE SERVICE.—The term ‘online service’ means any internet-facing service, including a website, email, virtual private network, or custom application.”.

Page 26, beginning line 5, strike “paragraphs (6) through (11) as paragraphs (10) through (15)” and insert “paragraphs (6) through (11) as paragraphs (11) through (16)”.

Page 27, line 3, strike the closing quotes and the second period.

Page 27, beginning line 4, insert the following:

“(10) provide information to State, local, tribal, and territorial governments on the security benefits of .gov domain name registration services;”.

An amendment offered by Mr. Richmond.

Page 5, line 17, insert “and cybersecurity threats” after “cybersecurity risks”.

Page 19, strike lines 21 through 23.

Page 22, line 7, strike “prepare for, detect, protect against” and insert “protect against, detect”.

Page 6, beginning line 10, insert the following:

(2) DISCRETIONARY ELEMENTS.—The Cybersecurity Plan of a State described in paragraph (1) may include—

(A) cooperative programs developed by groups of local, Tribal, and territorial governments within such State to address cybersecurity risks and cybersecurity threats; and

(B) programs provided by such State to support local, Tribal, and territorial governments and critical infrastructure owners and operators to address cybersecurity risks and cybersecurity threats.

The Committee adopted H.R. 5828, as amended, by unanimous consent.

The following amendment was offered and agreed to by unanimous consent:

An amendment offered by Mrs. Lesko.

In section 2, amend subsection (a) to read as follows:

(a) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There is authorized to be appropriated to the Commissioner of U.S. Customs and Border Protection \$1,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2021 and 2022 to carry out remediation operations of illicit cross-border tunnels.

A unanimous consent request by the Chairman that H.R. 5802; H.R. 5824; and S. 2035 be considered, adopted, and ordered to be reported without amendment to the House with a favorable recommendation; was not objected to.

A motion by Ms. Torres Small that, pursuant to Rule XXII, clause 1, the Committee authorizes the Chair to offer such motions as may be necessary in the House to go to conference with the Senate on H.R. 5736; H.R. 5780; H.R. 5802; H.R. 5804; H.R. 5811; H.R. 5822; H.R. 5823; H.R. 5824; H.R. 5828; and S. 2035, or any similar measure, was NOT OBJECTED TO.
