TITLE I—ENSURING EQUITY IN FEDERAL DISASTER MANAGE MENT

4 SEC. 101. DATA COLLECTION, ANALYSIS, AND CRITERIA.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year after the 6 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall, in 7 consultation with the Secretary of Housing and Urban De-8 velopment and the Administrator of the Small Business 9 Administration, develop and implement a process to en-10 sure equity in the provision of Federal assistance and 11 throughout all programs and policies of the Agency.

12 (b) SPECIFIC AREAS FOR CONSULTATION.—In car-13 rying out subsection (a), the Administrator shall identify 14 requirements for ensuring the quality, consistency, acces-15 sibility, and availability of information needed to identify 16 programs and policies of the Agency that may not support 17 the provision of equitable Federal assistance, including—

18 (1) information requirements;

19 (2) data sources and collection methods; and

20 (3) strategies for overcoming data or other in-21 formation challenges.

(c) MODIFICATION OF DATA COLLECTION SYSTEMS.—The Administrator shall modify the data collection systems of the Agency based on the process developed
under subsection (a) to ensure the quality, consistency, ac-

cessibility, and availability of information needed to iden tify any programs and policies of the Agency that may
 not support the provision of equitable Federal assistance.
 SEC. 102. CRITERIA FOR ENSURING EQUITY IN POLICIES
 AND PROGRAMS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year after the 7 date of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall de-8 velop, disseminate, and update, as appropriate, criteria to 9 apply to policies and programs of the Agency to ensure 10 equity in the provision of Federal assistance and through-11 out all programs and policies of the Agency.

(b) CONSULTATION.—In developing and dissemi13 nating the criteria required under subsection (a), the Ad14 ministrator shall consult with—

(1) the Office for Civil Rights and Civil Lib-erties of the Department of Homeland Security;

19 (3) the Small Business Administration.

20 (c) INTEGRATION OF CRITERIA.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator shall, to
the maximum extent possible, integrate the criteria

- 17 (3) any impacts of such criteria and processes
 18 on the provision of Federal assistance, with specific
 19 attention to impacts related to efforts within the
 20 Agency to address barriers to access and reducing
 21 disparate outcomes.

TITLE II—OPERATIONAL EN HANCEMENT TO IMPROVE EQUITY IN FEDERAL DIS ASTER MANAGEMENT

5 SEC. 201. EQUITY ADVISOR.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator shall designate 7 a senior official within the Agency as an equity advisor 8 to the Administrator to be responsible for advising the Ad-9 ministrator on Agency efforts to ensure equity in the pro-10 vision of Federal assistance and throughout all programs 11 and policies of the Agency.

(b) QUALIFICATIONS.—In designating an equity advisor under subsection (a), the Administrator shall select an
individual who is a qualified expert with significant experience with respect to equity policy, civil rights policy, or
programmatic reforms.

17 (c) DUTIES.—In addition to advising the Adminis18 trator, the equity advisor designated under subsection (a)
19 shall—

20 (1) participate in the implementation of sec-21 tions 101 and 102;

(2) monitor equity the implementation of equity
efforts within the Agency and within Federal Emergency Management Agency Regions to ensure consistency in the implementation of policy or pro-

grammatic changes intended to ensure equity in the
 provision of Federal assistance and throughout all
 programs and policies of the Agency;

4 (3) identify ways to improve the policies and 5 programs of the Agency to ensure that such policies 6 and programs are equitable, including enhancing op-7 portunities to support underserved populations in 8 preparedness, mitigation, protection, response, and 9 recovery; and

10 (4) any other activities the Administrator con-11 siders appropriate.

12 (d) CONSULTATION.—In carrying out the duties 13 under this section, the equity advisor shall, on an ongoing 14 basis, consult with representatives of underserved commu-15 nities, including communities directly impacted by disas-16 ters, to evaluate opportunities and develop approaches to 17 advancing equity within the Agency, including by increas-18 ing coordination, communication, and engagement with—

- 19 (1) community-based organizations;
- 20 (2) civil rights organizations;
- 21 (3) institutions of higher education;
- 22 (4) research institutions;
- 23 (5) academic organizations specializing in diver-
- 24 sity, equity, and inclusion issues; and
- 25 (6) religious and faith-based organizations.

1 SEC. 202. EQUITY ENTERPRISE STEERING GROUP.

2 (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established in the
3 Agency a steering group to advise the Administrator on
4 how to ensure equity in the provision of Federal assistance
5 and throughout all programs and policies of the Agency.
6 (b) RESPONSIBILITIES.—In carrying out subsection
7 (a), the steering group established under this section

- 9 (1) review and, as appropriate, recommend
 10 changes to Agency-wide policies, procedures, plans,

11SEC. 301. GAO REVIEW OF FACTORS TO DETERMINE AS-12SISTANCE.

13 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than one year after the 14 date of enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General 15 of the United States shall issue a report describing the factors the Agency considers when evaluating a request 16 from a Governor to declare that a major disaster or emer-17 gency exists and to authorize assistance under sections 18 19 402, 403, 406, 407, 408, 428, and 502 of the Robert T. 20 Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act 21 (42 U.S.C. 5170a et seq.).

(b) CONTENTS.—The report issued under subsection(a) shall include—
