- To require reporting regarding accreditation of basic training programs of the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "DHS Basic Training5 Accreditation Improvement Act of 2025".

6 SEC. 2. REPORTING ON BASIC TRAINING PROGRAMS OF

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THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY.

8 (a) ANNUAL REPORTING.—

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1 (1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after 2 the date of the enactment of this Act and annually thereafter, the Secretary of Homeland Security shall 3 4 report to the relevant congressional committees on 5 the accreditation status for each basic training pro-6 gram within the Department of Homeland Security 7 in existence as of such date of enactment, including 8 information relating to the following:

9 (A) The date on which each such program achieved initial accreditation, or in the case of 10 11 a program that is not currently accredited, the 12 reasons for not obtaining or maintaining ac-13 creditation, the activities, if any, taken to 14 achieve accreditation, and an anticipated 15 timeline for accreditation of such program.

16 (B) The date each such program most re17 cently received accreditation or reaccreditation,
18 if applicable.

19 (C) Each such program's anticipated ac-20 creditation or next reaccreditation date.

(D) The identification, including name, of
the accreditation manager for each such program.

24 (2) TERMINATION OF REPORTING REQUIRE25 MENT.—Annual reports under paragraph (1) shall

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terminate when all basic training programs of the
 Department of Homeland Security referred to iun
 such paragraph are accredited.

4 (b) LAPSE IN ACCREDITATION.—

5 (1) IN GENERAL.—If a basic training program 6 of the Department of Homeland Security loses ac-7 creditation, the head of the relevant component of 8 the Department shall notify the Secretary of Home-9 land Security not later than 30 days after such loss.

10 (2) NOTICE TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 30 11 days after receiving a notification pursuant to para-12 graph (1), the Secretary of Homeland Security shall 13 notify the relevant congressional committees of the 14 lapse in accreditation at issue, the reason for such 15 lapse, and the activities underway and planned to re-16 gain accreditation.

17 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) ACCREDITATION.—The term "accreditation" means the recognition by a board that a basic
training program is administered, developed, and delivered according to an applicable set of standards.
(2) ACCREDITATION MANAGER.—The term "accreditation manager" means the individual assigned
by the component of the Department of Homeland

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Security to manage accreditation activities for a
 basic training program.

3 (3)BASIC TRAINING PROGRAM.—The term "basic training program" means an entry level pro-4 5 gram of the Department of Homeland Security that 6 is transitional to law enforcement or law enforce-7 ment support, provides training on critical com-8 petencies and responsibilities, and is typically a re-9 quirement for appointment to a law enforcement or 10 law enforcement support job series.

(4) REACCREDITATION.—The term "reaccreditation" means the assessment of a basic training
program after initial accreditation to ensure the continued compliance with an applicable set of standards.

16 (5)Relevant CONGRESSIONAL COMMIT-17 TEES.—The term "relevant congressional commit-18 tees" means the Committee on Homeland Security 19 and the Committee on the Judiciary of the House of 20 Representatives and the Committee on Homeland 21 Security and Governmental Affairs and the Com-22 mittee of the Judiciary of the Senate.

23 SEC. 3. RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT.

24 The Under Secretary for Science and Technology of25 the Department of Homeland Security shall carry out re-

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search and development of systems and technologies to en-1 hance access to training offered by the Federal Law En-2 3 forcement Training Centers to State, local, Tribal, and territorial law enforcement, with particular attention to 4 law enforcement in rural and remote communities, for the 5 purpose of enhancing domestic preparedness for and col-6 lective response to terrorism and other homeland security 7 8 threats.
