A BILL

- To strengthen partnerships between historically Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions and the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Historically Black Col3 leges and Universities (HBCUs) Homeland Security Part4 nerships Act".

5 SEC. 2. DEPARTMENT-WIDE STRATEGY FOR ENHANCED 6 PARTNERSHIPS WITH HISTORICALLY BLACK 7 COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES AND MINOR8 ITY-SERVING INSTITUTIONS.

9 Not later than 90 days after the date of the enact10 ment of this Act, the Secretary, acting through the Under
11 Secretary for Strategy, Policy, and Plans of the Depart12 ment, shall—

(1) issue a Department-wide strategy to enhance partnerships with historically Black colleges
and universities and minority-serving institutions
that includes yearly goals through fiscal year 2024;
and

18 (2) require the head of each component of the19 Department to—

20 (A) not later than 150 days after the date
21 of the issuance under paragraph (1) of the De22 partment-wide strategy, develop a component23 specific action plan to implement such strategy;
24 (B) monitor progress on such implementa-

tion; and

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1	(C) not later than one year after the date
2	of such issuance, report to the Secretary re-
3	garding progress on such implementation.

4 SEC. 3. ENHANCEMENT OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

PARTNERSHIPS.

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6 The Under Secretary for Science and Technology of 7 the Department shall seek to enhance partnerships with 8 historically Black colleges and universities and minority-9 serving institutions with respect to administering the pri-10 mary research and development activities of the Depart-11 ment by, among other things—

(1) encouraging the participation of such colleges, universities, and institutions in the research,
development, testing, and evaluation programs and
activities of the Department;

16 (2) facilitating partnerships between such col17 leges, universities, and institutions and private sec18 tor stakeholders, national laboratories, and other
19 academic institutions in areas important to home20 land security; and

(3) distributing funds through Science and
Technology Directorate grants, cooperative agreements, and contracts to such colleges, universities,
and institutions for enhancements in areas important to homeland security.

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1 SEC. 4. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES PARTNERSHIPS.

2 Not later than 120 days after the date of the enact-3 ment of this Act, the Secretary, acting through the Chief Human Capitol Officer of the Department, shall make 4 5 available to historically Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions a current list of internship, 6 7 fellowship, scholarship, and recruitment opportunities 8 within the Department for students and recent graduates 9 of such colleges, universities, and institutions.

10SEC. 5. OPPORTUNITIES FOR 8(a) PROGRAM PARTNER-11SHIPS.

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of 13 the Small Business Administration shall publish eligibility 14 criteria on how historically Black colleges and universities 15 16 and minority-serving institutions may qualify to participate in Federal acquisitions authorized pursuant to sec-17 tion 8(a) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 637(a); 18 19 Public Law 85–536).

(b) DEPARTMENT ACTIONS.—Upon publication of
eligibility criteria in accordance with subsection (a), the
Secretary shall disseminate information to historically
Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions regarding—

25 (1) how to establish such eligibility; and

(2) current and future opportunities to partici pate in Federal acquisitions authorized pursuant to
 section 8(a) of the Small Business Act.

4 SEC. 6. ANNUAL REPORT.

5 (a) ANNUAL REPORT.—Not later than December 31, 2020, and annually thereafter through 2026, the Sec-6 7 retary shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Secu-8 rity of the House of Representatives and the Committee 9 on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the 10 Senate a report on the efforts of the Department to partner with historically Black colleges and universities and 11 12 minority-serving institutions to carry out this Act.

(b) REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.—The annual reports required under subsection (a) shall include the following:

16 A list of awards, including the (1)cor-17 responding monetary value for each such award, to 18 historically Black colleges and universities and mi-19 nority-serving institutions, disaggregated by grant, 20 contract, cooperative agreement, and other research 21 development test and evaluation activity, initiative, 22 and program.

(2) A description of how the Department is
partnering with historically Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions under the

programs referred to in sections 3 and 5, and how
 such programs have helped such colleges, univer sities, and institutions participate in acquisitions
 with the Department.

5 (3) A summary of outreach efforts to histori-6 cally Black colleges and universities and minority-7 serving institutions, and an identification of any De-8 partment programs and initiatives in which such col-9 leges, universities, and institutions are under-rep-10 resented among institutions of higher education.

(4) A description of the status of efforts made
by the Department pursuant to sections 2 and 4, including—

(A) for section 2, Department-wide goals
pursuant to the Department-wide strategy to
enhance partnerships with historically Black
colleges and universities and minority-serving
institutions under such section, and the status
of efforts to implement action plans throughout
the Department to carry out such strategy; and

(B) for section 4, participation rates in
each internship, fellowship, scholarship, and recruitment opportunity referred to in such section, listed by historically Black college and uni-

1	versity and minority-serving institution so par-
2	ticipating.
3	SEC. 7. DEFINITIONS.
4	In this Act:
5	(1) DEPARTMENT.—The term "Department"
6	means the Department of Homeland Security.
7	(2) HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES AND UNI-
8	VERSITIES.—The term "historically Black colleges
9	and universities" means a part B institution de-
10	scribed in section $322(2)$ of the Higher Education
11	Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1061(2)).
12	(3) INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION.—The
13	term "institution of higher education" has the
14	meaning given such term in section 101 of the High-
15	er Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001).
16	(4) MINORITY-SERVING INSTITUTIONS.—The
17	term "minority-serving institutions" means an insti-
18	tution of higher education described in section
19	371(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
20	U.S.C. 1067q(a)).
21	(5) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means
22	Secretary of Homeland Security.

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
