COMMITTEE ACTION

The Committee on Homeland Security met, pursuant to notice, in open markup session, a quorum being present, on Wednesday, April 28, 2016, in 311 Cannon House Office Building to consider the following measures:

H.R. 1887, (Mr. Zeldin) To amend certain appropriation Acts to repeal the requirement directing the Administrator of General Services to sell Federal property and assets that support the operations of the Plum Island Animal Disease Center in Plum Island, New York, and for other purposes.

H.R. 4743, (Mr. Castro of Texas) To authorize the Secretary of Homeland Security to establish a National Cybersecurity Preparedness Consortium, and for other purposes. The “National Cybersecurity Preparedness Consortium Act of 2016”.

H.R. 5056, (Mr. Keating) To modernize and enhance airport perimeter and access control security by requiring updated risk assessments and the development of security strategies, and for other purposes. The “Airport Perimeter and Access Control Security Act of 2016”.

The Committee took the following actions:

Mr. McCaul discharged the Subcommittee on Cybersecurity, Infrastructure Protection, and Security Technologies from further consideration of H.R. 1887 and H.R. 4743, without objection.

A unanimous consent request by Mr. McCaul that: The Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to H.R. 1887 be adopted; the amendments on the roster by Ms. Jackson Lee to the Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to H.R. 4743 be adopted; the Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute to H.R. 4743, as amended, be adopted; that the Committee order H.R. 1887 and H.R. 4743 reported to the House, as amended, with a favorable recommendation; that the Committee order H.R. 5056 reported to the House, without amendment, with a favorable recommendation; and that Staff be authorized to make technical and conforming changes to H.R. 1887 and H.R. 4743, was not objected to.

H.R. 4743, to authorize the Secretary of Homeland Security to establish a National Cybersecurity Preparedness Consortium, and for other purposes; was ordered to be reported to the House of Representatives with a favorable recommendation, as amended, by unanimous consent.

The Chair discharged the Subcommittee on Cybersecurity, Infrastructure Protection, and Security Technologies from further consideration of H.R. 4743.

The following amendments were offered:

An Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute offered by Mr. Richmond (#1); was AGREED TO, as amended, by unanimous consent.

An amendment to the Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute offered by Ms. Jackson Lee (#1A); In section 2(a), insert a comma after ‘Consortium’.
In section 2, insert after subsection (d) a new subsection (and redesignate subsequent subsections accordingly) entitled “(d) Metrics.”; was AGREED TO, by unanimous consent.

An amendment to the Amendment in the Nature of a Substitute offered by Ms. Jackson Lee (#1B); In subsection (a) of section 2, insert a comma after ‘Consortium’.
In paragraph (6) of section 2(b), insert before the period at the end the following: “, including continuity of operations plans”.; was AGREED TO, by unanimous consent.

Without objection, the Chair authorized staff to make technical and conforming corrections to H.R. 1887.

H.R. 5056, to modernize and enhance airport perimeter and access control security by requiring updated risk assessments and the development of security strategies, and for other purposes; was ordered to be reported to the House of Representatives with a favorable recommendation, without amendment, by unanimous consent.

A motion by Mr. King that, pursuant to Rule XXII, clause 1, the Committee authorizes the Chair to offer such motions as may be necessary in the House to go to conference with the Senate on H.R. 1887, H.R. 4743, and H.R. 5056, or any similar measure, was NOT OBJECTED TO.

A motion by Mr. Thompson of Mississippi that, pursuant to Rule XI clause 2(l), Members may have two days in which to file any supplemental, minority, additional, or dissenting views on H.R. 1887, H.R. 4743, and H.R. 5056, was NOT OBJECTED TO.
