### A BILL

- To strengthen partnerships between historically Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions and the Department of Homeland Security, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Historically Black Col-
- 5 leges and Universities (HBCUs) Homeland Security Part-
- 6 nerships Act".

1	SEC.	2.	DEPARTMENT-WIDE STRATEGY FOR ENHANCED
2			PARTNERSHIPS WITH HISTORICALLY BLACK
3			COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES AND MINOR-
4			ITY-SERVING INSTITUTIONS.

5 Not later than 90 days after the date of the enact6 ment of this Act, the Secretary, acting through the Under
7 Secretary for Strategy, Policy, and Plans of the Depart8 ment, shall—

9 (1) issue a Department-wide strategy to en-10 hance partnerships with historically Black colleges 11 and universities and minority-serving institutions 12 that includes yearly goals through fiscal year 2024; 13 and

14 (2) require the head of each component of the15 Department to—

16 (A) not later than 150 days after the date
17 of the issuance under paragraph (1) of the De18 partment-wide strategy, develop a component19 specific action plan to implement such strategy;

20 (B) monitor progress on such implementa-21 tion; and

(C) not later than one year after the date
of such issuance, report to the Secretary regarding progress on such implementation.

# 1SEC. 3. ENHANCEMENT OF RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT2PARTNERSHIPS.

The Under Secretary for Science and Technology of the Department shall seek to enhance partnerships with historically Black colleges and universities and minorityserving institutions with respect to administering the primary research and development activities of the Department by, among other things—

9 (1) encouraging the participation of such col10 leges, universities, and institutions in the research,
11 development, testing, and evaluation programs and
12 activities of the Department;

(2) facilitating partnerships between such colleges, universities, and institutions and private sector stakeholders, national laboratories, and other
academic institutions in areas important to homeland security; and

(3) distributing funds through Science and
Technology Directorate grants, cooperative agreements, and contracts to such colleges, universities,
and institutions for enhancements in areas important to homeland security.

#### 23 SEC. 4. CAREER OPPORTUNITIES PARTNERSHIPS.

Not later than 120 days after the date of the enact25 ment of this Act, the Secretary, acting through the Chief
26 Human Capitol Officer of the Department, shall make
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available to historically Black colleges and universities and
 minority-serving institutions a current list of internship,
 fellowship, scholarship, and recruitment opportunities
 within the Department for students and recent graduates
 of such colleges, universities, and institutions.

## 6 SEC. 5. OPPORTUNITIES FOR 8(a) PROGRAM PARTNER7 SHIPS.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 90 days after the 9 date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of 10 the Small Business Administration shall publish eligibility criteria on how historically Black colleges and universities 11 12 and minority-serving institutions may qualify to partici-13 pate in Federal acquisitions authorized pursuant to section 8(a) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C. 637(a); 14 15 Public Law 85–536).

(b) DEPARTMENT ACTIONS.—Upon publication of
eligibility criteria in accordance with subsection (a), the
Secretary shall disseminate information to historically
Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions regarding—

21 (1) how to establish such eligibility; and

(2) current and future opportunities to participate in Federal acquisitions authorized pursuant to
section 8(a) of the Small Business Act.

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### 1 SEC. 6. ANNUAL REPORT.

2 (a) ANNUAL REPORT.—Not later than December 31, 3 2020, and annually thereafter through 2026, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Homeland Secu-4 5 rity of the House of Representatives and the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs of the 6 7 Senate a report on the efforts of the Department to part-8 ner with historically Black colleges and universities and 9 minority-serving institutions to carry out this Act.

10 (b) REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.—The annual re11 ports required under subsection (a) shall include the fol12 lowing:

(1) A list of awards, including the corresponding monetary value for each such award, to
historically Black colleges and universities and minority-serving institutions, disaggregated by grant,
contract, cooperative agreement, and other research
development test and evaluation activity, initiative,
and program.

20 (2) A description of how the Department is
21 partnering with historically Black colleges and uni22 versities and minority-serving institutions under the
23 programs referred to in sections 3 and 5, and how
24 such programs have helped such colleges, univer25 sities, and institutions participate in acquisitions
26 with the Department.

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1	(3) A summary of outreach efforts to histori-
2	cally Black colleges and universities and minority-
3	serving institutions, and an identification of any De-
4	partment programs and initiatives in which such col-
5	leges, universities, and institutions are under-rep-
6	resented among institutions of higher education.
7	(4) A description of the status of efforts made
8	by the Department pursuant to sections 2 and 4, in-
9	cluding—
10	(A) for section 2, Department-wide goals
11	pursuant to the Department-wide strategy to
12	enhance partnerships with historically Black
13	colleges and universities and minority-serving
14	institutions under such section, and the status
15	of efforts to implement action plans throughout
16	the Department to carry out such strategy; and
17	(B) for section 4, participation rates in
18	each internship, fellowship, scholarship, and re-
19	cruitment opportunity referred to in such sec-
20	tion, listed by historically Black college and uni-
21	versity and minority-serving institution so par-
22	ticipating.
23	SEC. 7. DEFINITIONS.
24	In this Act:

1	(1) DEPARTMENT.—The term "Department"
2	means the Department of Homeland Security.
3	(2) HISTORICALLY BLACK COLLEGES AND UNI-
4	VERSITIES.—The term "historically Black colleges
5	and universities" means a part B institution de-
6	scribed in section $322(2)$ of the Higher Education
7	Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1061(2)).
8	(3) INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION.—The
9	term "institution of higher education" has the
10	meaning given such term in section 101 of the High-
11	er Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001).
12	(4) MINORITY-SERVING INSTITUTIONS.—The
13	term "minority-serving institutions" means an insti-
14	tution of higher education described in section
15	371(a) of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20
16	U.S.C. 1067q(a)).
17	(5) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
18	Secretary of Homeland Security.
