## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Denying Infinite Secu-

- 5 rity and Government Resources Allocated toward Con-
- 6 victed and Extremely Dishonorable Former Protectees
- 7 Act" or the "DISGRACED Former Protectees Act".

## SEC. 2. DENYING CERTAIN FELONS SECRET SERVICE PRO TECTION.

Section 3056(a) of title 18, United States Code, is
amended by striking "declined." and inserting "declined.
The protection authorized in paragraphs (1) through (8)
shall terminate for any person upon sentencing following
conviction for a Federal or State offense that is punishable
for a term of imprisonment of at least one year.".
