**A BILL**

To provide that no Federal funds made available to the Department of Homeland Security or Department of Justice may be used to carry out any civil immigration enforcement activity within one mile of any 2026 Fédération Internationale de Football Association World Cup match or Fan Festival, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Save the World Cup  
3 Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. LIMITATION ON USE OF FUNDS.**

5 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Notwithstanding any other provi-  
6 sion of law, no Federal funds made available to the De-  
7 partment of Homeland Security or Department of Justice  
8 may be used, except under exigent circumstances, to carry  
9 out any civil immigration enforcement activity under the  
10 immigration laws (as such term is defined in section 101  
11 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101)),  
12 within one mile of any 2026 Fédération Internationale de  
13 Football Association (FIFA) World Cup match or FIFA  
14 Fan Festival.

15 (b) **EXIGENT CIRCUMSTANCES DEFINED.**—In this  
16 section, the term “exigent circumstances” means a situa-  
17 tion involving any of the following:

18 (1) The imminent risk of death, violence, or  
19 physical harm to a person, including in the case of  
20 terrorism (as such term is defined in section 2 of the  
21 Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 101)).

22 (2) The imminent risk to the national security  
23 of the United States.

24 (3) The immediate arrest or hot pursuit of an  
25 individual presenting an imminent risk to public

1 safety, including relating to death, violence, or phys-  
2 ical harm to a person.

3 (4) The imminent risk of destruction of evi-  
4 dence that is material to an ongoing criminal case.
